Home visit - there is a sheet available to sign up for these visits.

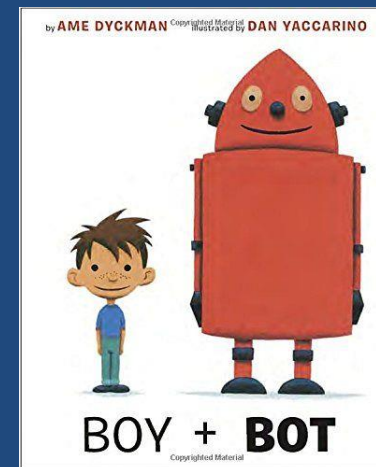
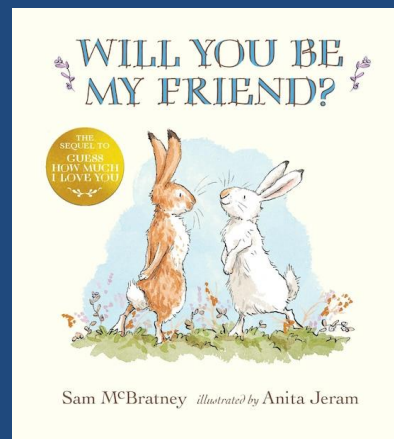
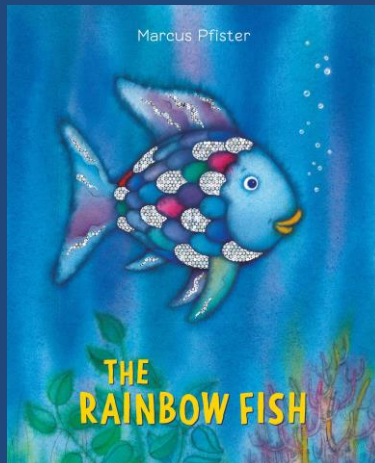
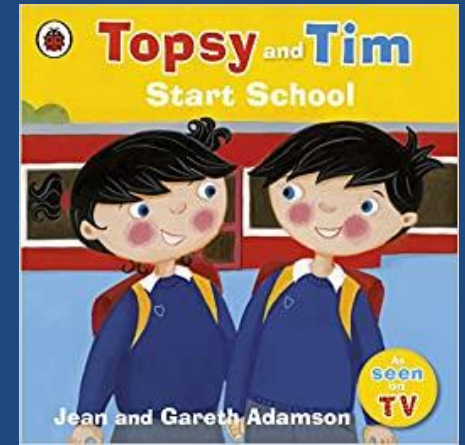
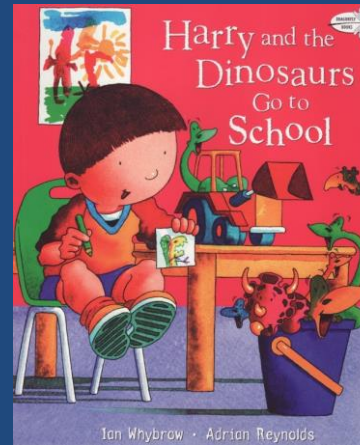
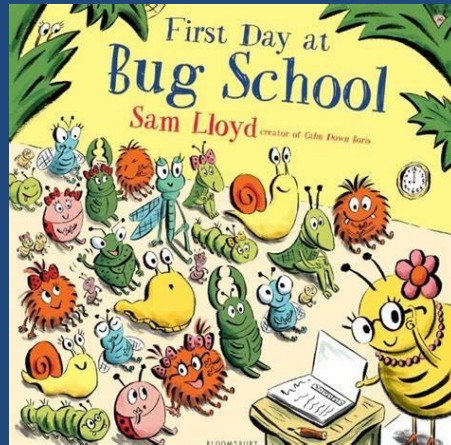
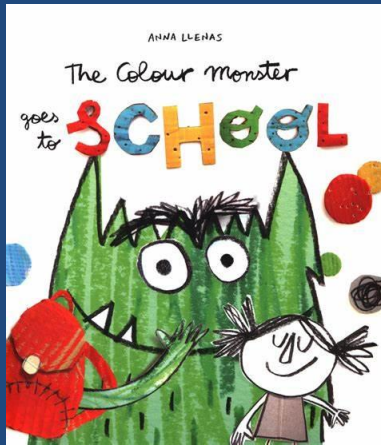


Preparing for Starting School

- Build up independence - clothes, toilet, looking after their possessions, using knife and fork
- Responsibility - small jobs, carry own bag, tidy up
- Lots of conversation, singing rhymes, counting, stories, recognising their name
- Practise and familiarise route to school - you could play 'eye spy' as you go
- Roleplay with toys how to start conversations to support making new friends... "Hello, my name is... What is your name? Can I play with you?"
