Guidelines

We have high expectations of our pupils at all times, and they must be in regulation school uniform. Long hair must be tied back, hairbands must be small and plain (colourful, broad bands or those with large bows need to be kept for outside of school please). Jewellery should not be worn to school, with the exception of stud earrings and watches that do not connect to the internet. Summer dresses should be the standard short sleeved gingham pattern. Only PE kit as outlined on the kit list can be worn. If your child is going to wear trainers as their school shoes, they must be plain black otherwise black school shoes please. Please continue to help us by ensuring that your children follow the uniform, phone and punctuality rules that are in place year-round.

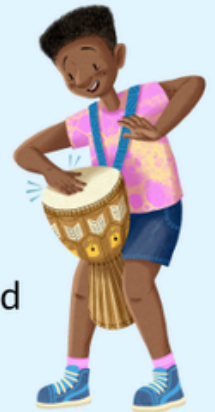
