CURRICULUM DETAIL

- Phonics is taught through RWI and then reading and comprehension is taught through Master Reader.
- Writing is taught through Talk for Writing.
- Maths is taught through White Rose.
- Year 1 have a statutory phonics screening in June.
- There are informal assessments throughout the year, the children will not be aware of these and we use this to inform our future planning.
- Growth Mindset is taught and underpins everything we do in class, the children need to have independence and acceptance of learning from mistakes.

HOME SUPPORT

Reading books will be sent home on **Thursdays**.

Ensure the books are returned each day in your child's book bag. We will not send new books home if we do not have the previous one.

There will be half-termly common exception spelling words sent home (Year 1 and 2 only).

Frequent opportunities to practice number bonds to 10 and 20, talking about telling the time and using money.

CLASS ROUTINES

- **Morning routine:**

- Children come in on their own every morning and put their belongings away (either in their tray or on their peg).
- There is a morning challenge activity for the children to complete.
- The children will register and make their lunch choice. Please ensure your child knows what is on the menu each day.

- **Home routine:**

- Children will be released by an adult when they can see the parent / guardian.
- Please tell the adult on the door or in the office in the morning about any changes to who will collecting your child.

BEHAVIOUR

Our expectation is that all children will behave pro-socially by following instructions, listening, being sensible and participating in activities / tasks at school.

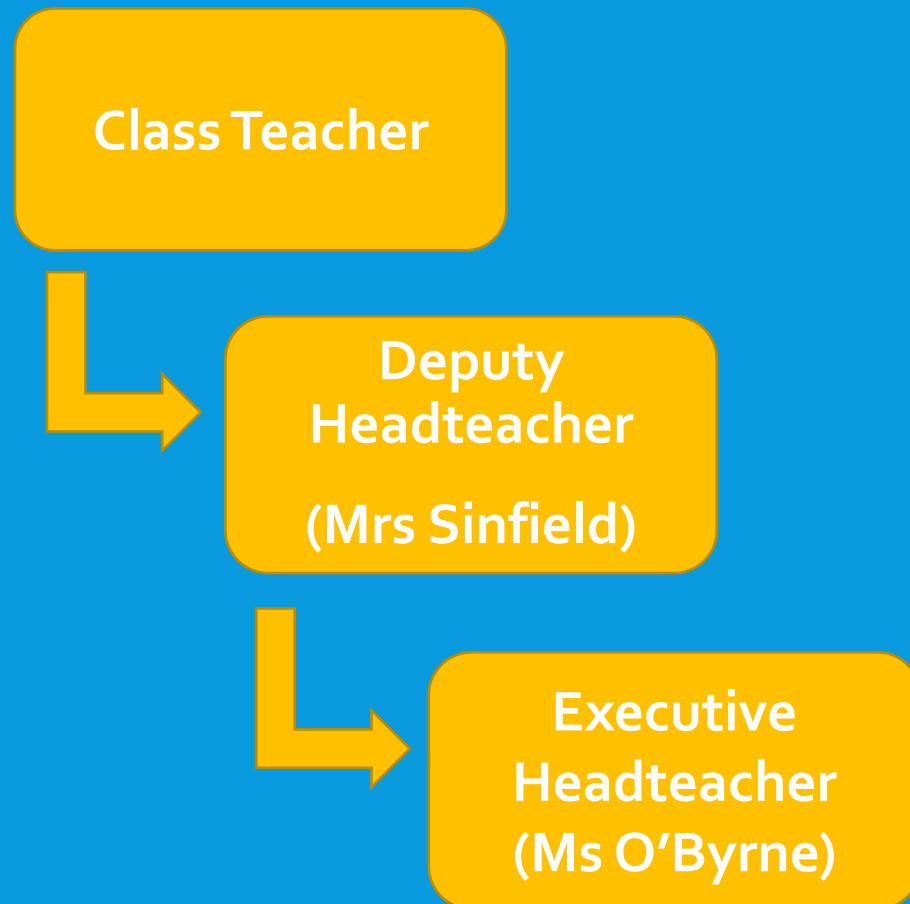
Pro social behaviours are rewarded with:	Consequences for unsocial behaviours

EXPECTATIONS

- Wear uniform (no trainers, unless PE day), long hair tied up.
- No jewelry, except a watch (no smart watches) and small stud earrings (unless for religious reasons).
- Refillable water bottle.
- Sun cream should be applied before coming to school and adults in school are not able to reapply.
- A pair of wellies brought into school.
- Coat in colder weather.
- All items labelled with name.
